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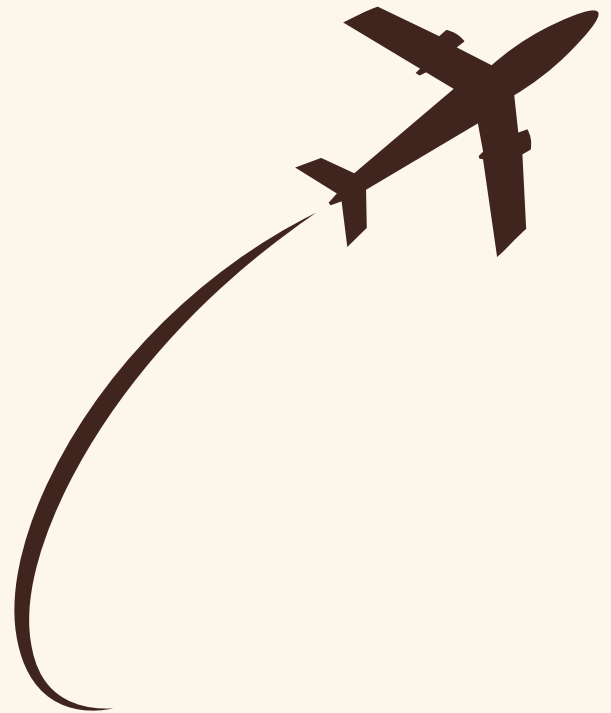


## Arriving

From Budapest Ferenc Liszt International Airport you can get to the city by bus **200E** or **100E**.

We recommend taking 200E, as it is cheaper, and you can use it with Budapest-pass (you can read about it on the next page).

Bus **200E** runs every 10 minutes between the airport and Kőbánya-Kispest metro station. From Kőbánya-Kispest metro station you can easily reach the major hubs of the city, e.g. **Deák Ferenc square**, **Kálvin square**, **Ferenciek square**, **Nyugati railway station** with **metro line 3**.

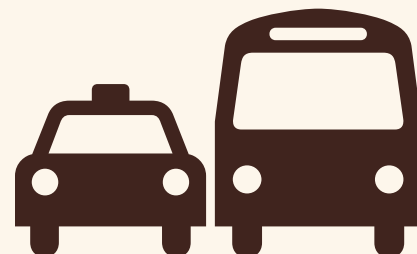




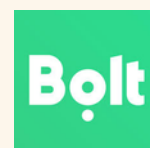
# Public transportation

There are two possible public transportation passes, you can buy when you visit Budapest during the staff week.

For all the tickets you buy, we recommend using BudapestGo application (can be downloaded on Android and iOS as well).

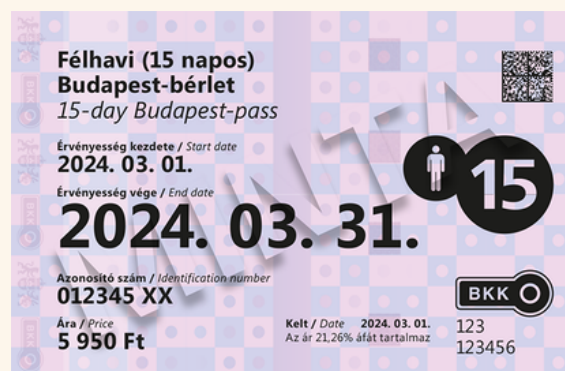


For **Taxi**, use Bolt application.



## Budapest-pass - 15-days

If you stay within the border of Budapest, we recommend buying a 15 days pass. It can be used with your ID card when the inspector checks it.



## Pest County Pass (30 days)

If you want to travel to the countryside (anywhere outside of the border of Budapest but within Pest county), you have to buy this pass.







# Public transportation

## Rent a bike with Bubi!



### Registration

Download the MOL Bubi app and register. When registering, enter your phone number and you will receive a PIN code via SMS which you can use to log in to the app. Then enter your personal details under Activate Account.

### Pick up

Pick up your bike with the QR-code scanner in the MOL Bubi app. Successful pickup is indicated when the smart lock opens with a loud click. After the beep, you're ready to roll.



### Park

Parking time is included in your usage time, so only use it for short stops at off-station locations. You can only return your bike at designated stations.

Start the parking function in the app first and then close the smart lock.

You need to end the parking session in the app by tapping on 'Resume rental' and you can continue cycling.



### Return

Return your bike to any MOL Bubi station and close the smart lock.

If you lock your bike at an off-station location, you will have to pay a service fee of 5,000 HUF.

Three beeps will indicate successful return, but you can also check this in the app.

## HOW TO USE TRAVELCARDS AND PASSES



**1**

Select the start of the validity period of the travelcard or pass



**2**

Buy travelcard or pass in BudapestGO



**3**

Scan the QR code at the metro station entrance or by the door on vehicles where you must board at the front



**4**

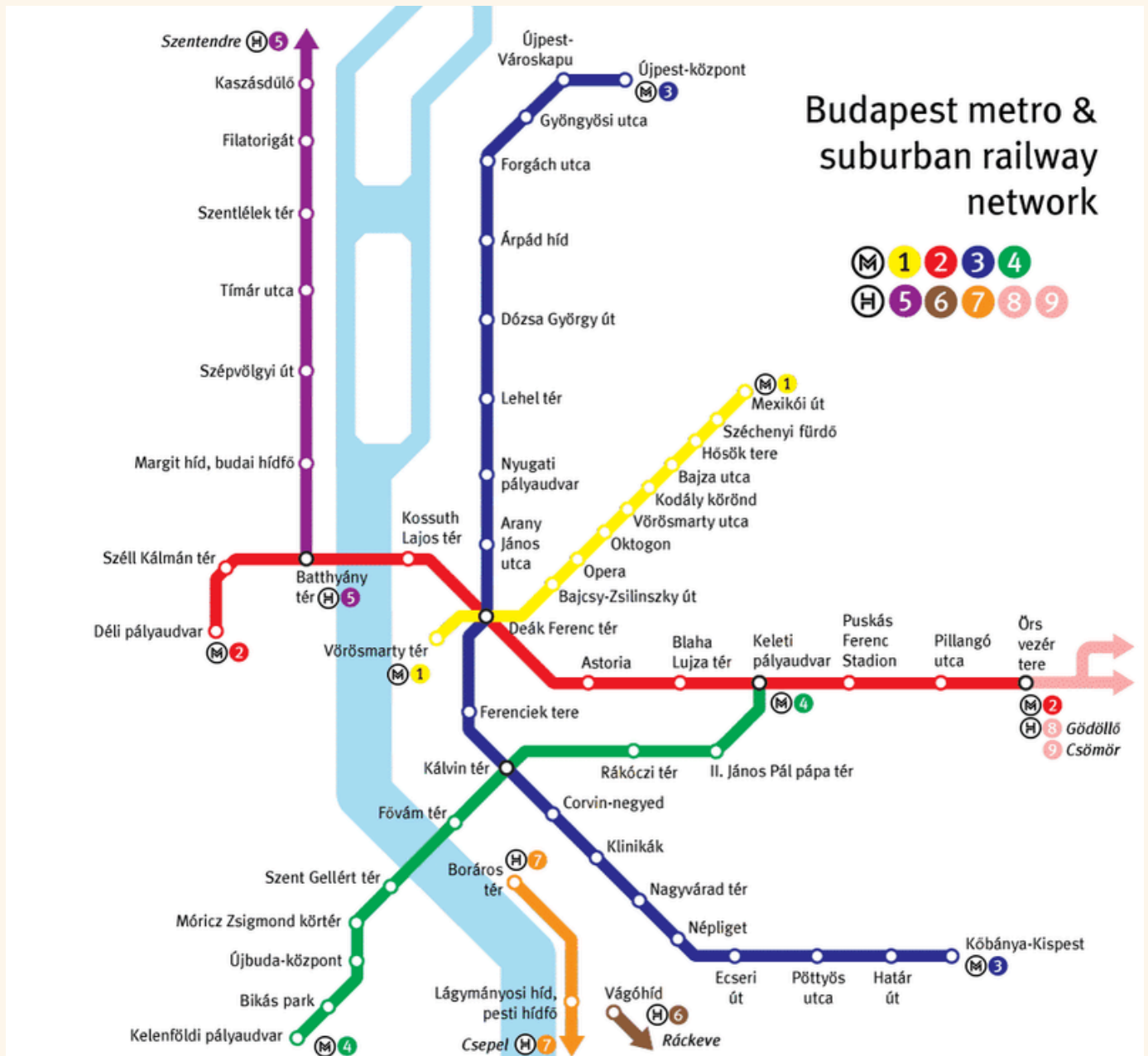
Show the moving animation to the ticket inspector, the driver of the front-door boarding only service or the access control staff



The Budapest pass is only valid within Budapest on lines 1-99, 101-299, 900-999, M1, M2, M3, M4, D14, and on HÉV within the city borders.
